www.onetcenter.org/IP.html – This site offers various forms of the Interest Profiler. Assessment results can then be linked to occupations high in the codes you select. www.onetonlineorg/explore/interests/Social/Enterprising/Artistic is one example.

www.cacareerzone.org – Select from “Quick Assessment”, “Interest Profiler” which has an alternative languages section, “Skills Profiler”, and “Work Importance Profiler”. Explore Occupations by Job Family or by Occupation. Many are linked to videos. Find colleges in your area of choice and search for training programs in California. Create an account to record your assessment summaries and exploration by cluster reports. The site also provides a Resume Builder, Letter Builder and Reference Builder.

www.myskillsmyfuture.org Enter your current or past job and find career matches

www.mynextmove.org – Select “Search careers with Key Words” and “Browse careers by industry” to find matching careers with modified O*Net information as well as links to O*NET Online. “Tell us what you like to do” links to the O*Net Interest Profiler which results in a RIASEC Holland Code.

www.truity.com offers a variety of assessments. Some are free; some are not. For information on Holland Codes and a no-charge Holland Assessment put “Holland” in the search box.
