

Salary Information Resources

1. Talk to people in the industry. Find out the salaries for positions one step above and one step below your targeted position. Try alternate job titles. Use your LinkedIn connections to get first-hand information.
2. Scan job announcements and Internet postings for salary information. Use Google to search by your specific interest area.

3. Use the following websites:

www.labormarketinfo.edd.ca.gov - This is the California EDD website. Select “Wages” for up to date information on employment & wages by occupation.

www.indeed.com/salaries - Put in job title or key word and zip code in the search box to receive the average salary for matching jobs in that location. Average salary of jobs with related titles is also available.

www.paysa.com – Salaries can be searched by job title or by company. Information is sometimes available for best cities or companies for a given job title.

www.jobstar.org - Click on “Salary Info”. Some of the links are out of date.

www.salary.com/salaries - Select “Personal” and register. Basic information is free.

www.careeronestop.org - Visit the “toolkit” and select “wages”

www.jobsearchintelligence.com - Select “Job Seekers” and “Salary Calculator”. Put in job title and your background to receive your personalized calculated salary

www.careerbliss.com -Employee reported reviews and wage data plus job search and career information by job title

www.linkedin.com/salary - This site builds from your LinkedIn headline and asks for more information in order to give you salary information

www.payscale.com – Put in your salary to see how your compensation compares to your peers. No charge for the basic report but there is a charge for the upgraded report.

www.glassdoor.com –Select “Salaries” from the top bar.

www.onetonline.org – Use Occupational Quick Search for career information that includes salary data.
